



How to Measure Flour

It is important to correctly measure flour for the best baked products!

Stir flour in the storage container. Lightly add it, spoonful-by-spoonful, into a dry measuring cup until very full. Don't pack it down or you'll have too much. Pull the straight edge of a knife or spatula over the top of the cup to level it off. If the recipe calls for several cups of flour, place the measured amounts in separate piles in the mixing bowl or on wax paper to make counting easier!

Remember, don't measure flour over the mixing bowl, spilling will throw off measurement!
